We need to join hands because- this crisis is bigger than anything human civilization has ever seen and to fight it we need to bring all our forces together. When we say we need to keep focusing on climate we forget, staying in our bubble won't save us. This is the most interconnected issue of our time and its solution needs to be interconnected as well.

Our political leaders and governments are not listening to us. We need to make them listen to us. We need to make them take the necessary steps. For that, we also need to create bigger grassroots movement connecting our issues. Do we want to live in a world where the climate has been saved but inequality, poverty, racism, sexism, xenophobia still exists?

The truth is- to solve the climate crisis we need to solve inequality, racism, sexism and xenophobia. For that- these are the reasons why we are facing this crisis today. In a recent report, we learned that emission from the richest 10% would be enough to push us above the 1.5 degree threshold even if the rest of the world cut their emission to zero.

Therefore, a key to fighting the crisis is building cross-sectional movement. I am proud of what has taken place in Heidelberg today. I look forward to learning and sharing more with you all. Let's keep fighting together for a better future.
